Digital Key usage charter: Software certificate for accessing the IS and using the RTE Applications

A Digital Key (Software certificate) is made available to you in order to access the IS and use the RTE Applications. It will provide for your authentication and ensure the confidentiality of your exchanges with the IS and the RTE Applications.

The Digital Key is strictly personal and non-transferable. You are entirely responsible for its usage and protection.

Consequently any access to the RTE IS and any usage of a RTE Application carried out using the Digital Key are considered to have been made by you.

By downloading this Digital Key, you undertake to ensure its protection and to take all useful measures to see that it is not disclosed to or used by third parties.

In case of loss of your Digital Key or of doubts regarding its fraudulent usage, you must immediately call the *RTE Hotline* on 00 800 80 50 50 50 to request its revocation.

During the revocation procedure, you must absolutely provide the **User Identifier** that you had entered during the request for your Digital Key, in form 1 of the Technical Record for access to the IS and usage of the RTE Applications.

We also inform you that, as a security measure, RTE can request the replacement of your Digital Key.

Finally, before any access to the RTE Applications, we ask you to consult :

- firstly, the Rules for accessing the Information System and using the RTE Applications, and the General IS Appendix, which define the general conditions applicable to the access to the IS and to the usage of the Applications for the performance of the Service;
- secondly, the "RTE France" Certification Authority Certification Policy, which contains all of the rules and obligations governing the usage of your Digital Key.
